ST. PETER'S CHURCH CLEANING

EQUIPMENT

In kitchen/lavatory

Dyson cleaner.

Broom – for use in porch and kitchen.

Cobweb brush.

Dust pan & brush.

Hand held cleaner for carpets and kneelers on the shelf.

Toilet rolls – in cupboard over toilet.

In cupboard above kitchen sink

Dish cloths, tea towels, floor cloths/pieces of old towel.

Polishes, brushes, cloths.

Plastic bags for rubbish disposal.

1001 carpet cleaner.

Clean towels.

ROUTINE WEEKLY CLEANING – PLEASE:

1. Clean the kitchen sink and lavatory. Check hand towel, take to wash and replace as necessary.
2. Sweep out the porch and clean the mats.
3. Dust all pews and the pulpit.
4. Hoover all carpets including the information area.
Spot clean as necessary.
5. Dust in the gallery (hoover only if necessary).
6. Dust and hoover in the belfry downstairs and empty bin.
7. Dust and hoover in the vestry, empty the bin and shake the door mat.
8. Clean the glass in the main entrance doors.
9. Remove any flowers from the ledges in church which are over their best. Dispose of them in the bins beside the gate to the churchyard. Flowers by both altars should be left.
10. Empty hoovers after use.
11. Please take rubbish and anything suitable for recycling home with you (the bin men do not collect from church).

ADDITIONAL TEAM ROUTINES – PLEASE:

1st TEAM (Margaret, Jeremy and Deborah)

1. Clean the pews on the right/south side of main aisle.
Remove the kneelers, hoover the floor, seat runners and kneelers and replace.
2. Polish the choir stalls on the right/south side. Hoover the floor, seat runners and kneelers.
3. Polish rails of both altars and the pulpit.

2nd TEAM (Carole Young, Lucy and Carole Johnson)

1. Clean the pews on the left/north side of the main aisle.
Remove the kneelers, hoover the floor, seat runners and replace.
2. Polish the choir stalls on the left/north side. Hoover the floor, seat runners and kneelers.
3. Polish rails of both altars and oak panelling in the sanctuary.

3rd TEAM (Judith and Lorinda)

1. Clean the pews on the right/south side of the north aisle.
Remove the kneelers, hoover the floor, seat runners and kneelers and replace.
2. Polish the choir stalls on the right/south side. Hoover the floor, seat runners and kneelers.
3. Polish rails on both altars and polish main altar.

4th TEAM (Robert, Christine and Alex)

1. Clean the pews on the left/north side of north aisle. Remove the kneelers, hoover the floor, seat runners and kneelers and replace.
2. Polish the choir stalls on the left/north side. Hoover the floor, seat runners and kneelers.
3. Polish rails of both altars and vestment press in the vestry.
