Echoes of Cadfael... Inspired by **Ian Aldred**'s article last month about the regal 'Matildas' (take a look back at the 'family tree' in that piece), **Robin Leleux** shares more of the history of 'Empress' Matilda, who you might recognise from Ellis Peter's stories about 'Brother Cadfael'...

Born in 1102, **Matilda** was shipped off to Germany at the age of 8, and by 12 was married to **Emperor Henry V**. She regarded Germany as her country and spoke <u>German. She rul</u>ed wisely and sympathetically when her husband was away, and



continued as regent after he died in 1125. She bitterly opposed her next, political, marriage to **Geoffrey of Anjou**. They soon quarrelled, but nevertheless a son, the future Henry II, eventually arrived. On the death of her **father (Henry I)** in 1135, she quickly seized **Normandy**, but it was four years before she landed in England. By this time, her **cousin Stephen** had been crowned and had time to consolidate his position, though not his authority as several earls were eagerly seeking to extend their territories whilst others resorted to banditry. Bitter **civil war** broke out between Stephen and 'Empress'

Matilda. She set up court at Westminster but before she could get herself crowned she was driven out by Londoners tired of her arrogant and overbearing manner. Besieged in Oxford by Stephen, she escaped in winter across the snow, dressed in white. Both sides won some victories but neither was strong enough to dominate the whole country : the civil war was a **stalemate**, and in 1148 Matilda returned to Normandy, where she managed her domains effectively for twenty years. Her final achievement in England was to get Stephen to recognise her son Henry as his successor; and so **Henry II**, one of England's greatest kings, united England and Normandy again.

The latest news coming through from **our Link Diocese** in Sudan is of very terrible conditions there, as the civil war continues unabated and famine is now widespread. The United Nations says that the country is **the world's worst**

humanitarian crisis. There are ethnically-targetted **mass killings** and **destruction** in villages, and **attacks** even in refugee camps. The World Food Programme has extreme difficulty moving **aid** across warzones. Archbishop Ezekiel reports that in Khartoum, despite the conditions, "*The churches are full of Christians during worship and all the denominations work together in the spirit of ecumenism*". (More details are on the Sudan Prayer Board at the back of church.)
