22nd July: Mary Magdalene "The Apostle to the Apostles"

"Mary" was by far the most common name for Jewish women in the first century, so this Mary is known by the name of her home town, Magdala, a fishing village on the northwest shore of the Sea of Galilee, to distinguish her from Mary the mother of Jesus, Mary of Bethany (sister of Martha) and others. Mary Magdalene was one of a group of

women who travelled with Jesus, who we are told together helped support his ministry "out of their resources". (She is sometimes mistakenly confused with the un-named woman who washed Jesus feet with her hair, or cast as a repentant prostitute.) Jesus released her from the mental torment of "seven devils". She was a witness to both the crucifixion and the resurrection and, after "supposing him to be the gardener" it is she who Jesus calls by name and tells to take the eyewitness news of the resurrection to his frightened followers, earning her the title "apostle to the apostles".

Dearest Lord, may we, like Mary from Magdala, hear you call us by name, and be filled with such gratitude for your touch upon our lives that we dedicate ourselves to the mission you have entrusted to us. May our lives shine with the transforming truth that "we have seen the Lord", and share with those we meet the joys of new life which you offer now and in the world to come. Amen
