(This present short publication aims to keep a simple Source going until decisions are taken for the future.)

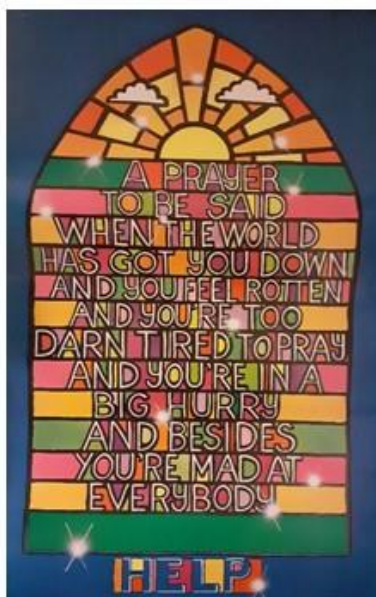
6th August: the Transfiguration a poem by Malcolm Guite

The weather is changeable at present after the very hot days we have had. Today I walked down onto the canal which was busy with people and even two boats coming along using the swing bridge as they passed by. It rained quite heavily as I turned for home.

A female blackbird has been visiting the back-door step awaiting raisins, she looks rather sad! But obviously has young ones as she is keen to take food.



In the Yorkshire Post there was a lovely picture of a Kingfisher overlooking a stream. Apparently they are found all around the world, but only the common kingfisher - *Alcedo atthis* - breeds in the UK. I remember seeing one regularly on the River Wharfe at Bolton Abbey early in the year with its electric blue and copper coloured plumage - and high pitched peeping calls.

This week I was busy in the garden with some new plants which I had just bought, they seemed to attract the Butterflies which is good news. They will be interesting to keep an eye on.
